Background

+ Registry Agreement Specification 7: Minimum requirements for rights protection mechanisms:

Registry Operator shall implement in accordance with requirements established by ICANN each of the mandatory RPMs set forth in the Trademark Clearinghouse (posted at [url to be inserted when final Trademark Clearinghouse is adopted]), which may be revised by ICANN from time to time.

+ RPM Requirements intended to fulfill the placeholder reference



Considerations in Drafting the RPM Requirements

- + Registry Operator has discretion to implement its TLD startup phases in accordance with its own business and operational models, so long as the minimum requirements contained in these TMCH Requirements are met.
- More standardization of procedures across new gTLDs
- + Supporting availability and consistency of information to promote rights holder and consumer knowledge

Sunrise Scheduling (Section 2)

- + Sunrise: provide an early opportunity to rights holders to register names in the TLD rights protection mechanism to offer priority based on verified TM data
- + Feedback/Questions:
 - + (2) Should Limited Registration Period(s) be able to precede Sunrise?
 - + (2.4.1) Can a registry implement prioritization within a sunrise?
 - + Can a registry run periods in parallel (e.g., collecting applications versus registration)?

Sunrise Eligibility (Section 2)

- Sunrise Eligibility for TM holders as verified by TMCH
- + Feedback/Questions:
 - + (2.2.4) Can other rights holders or other eligible parties register names in the Sunrise?
 - + (2.3.1) What does it mean that eligibility restrictions must be "applied equally" during Sunrise, Limited Registration, and Claims periods?



Sunrise Eligibility (Section 2)(continued)

- + Feedback/Questions:
 - + (2.3.1.3) Can registry choose not to apply eligibility restrictions in Sunrise (i.e., names can be registered or blocked by rights holders even if outside of eligibility requirements)?
 - + (2.4.3) How should registry policy be applied to allocation of IDN variant labels during a Sunrise period?



Asynchronous Registration Processes

- + Registry may wish to do auction, RFP, random, or other non-FCFS processes
- + Sunrise
 - + (2.5.3) Maximum time between provision of SMD and registration of domain name
- + Trademark Claims
 - + (3.4.3) Maximum time between acknowledgement of Claims Notice and registration of domain name
- + Both values currently 45 days



Reserved Names

- Registry operator may reserve names from registration per Registry Agreement
- + Trademark Claims service required for names released from reservation
