

## Letter to Viewees

Dear New gTLD Applicant,

As you are most likely aware, ICANN took the TLD application system offline on 12 April 2012 following reports that some users might have been able to see some file names and user names of other users.

A description of the glitch and its effects are described in announcements ICANN has made and posted on its web page <<http://newgtlds.icann.org/en/applicants/tas/interruption-updates>>. Even as late as yesterday, 7 May 2012, our packet-level research uncovered a new set of instances (in addition to the previously announced instances) where a set of system-generated file names might have been viewed by another applicant.

**Based on our analysis, you might have been one of the applicants who had file names and user names viewed by another applicant.**

Listed below is the particular information associated with your application that might have been viewed. After an extensive review, we have no evidence that any unauthorized users were able to download or view the contents of these attachments.

We continue to review the system logs and system traffic for additional information. If any new data affects our analysis, we will notify you immediately.
