

Proxy Terms and Conditions

1. The Proxy will communicate with the Applicant to obtain all information necessary to enable the Proxy to timely complete the purchase of a Ticket or Tickets on the Applicant's behalf during a time and date identified by ICANN (see <http://newgtlds.icann.org/en/applicants/prioritization-draw> (the "Purchase")).
2. The Proxy will arrange to timely receive from the Applicant the required fee for the Purchase, so that the Proxy can provide ICANN with payment pursuant to its Prioritization Draw Payment requirements. (See <http://newgtlds.icann.org/en/applicants/prioritization-draw>.)
3. At the time of purchase, the Proxy will provide, for each gTLD application being entered in the drawing: (i) a completed Proxy Designation Form that includes the name of the Applicant, the gTLD applicant Identification number(s) for which the purchaser has been designated as Proxy, the unique Prioritization Draw code that ICANN provided to the Applicants corresponding to the application(s), and the Proxy's name and contact information; (ii) proper government-issued photo identification containing the same name and contact information for the Proxy indicated on the Proxy Designation Form; and (iii) the required fee for the Purchase.
4. In exchange for the Purchase, the Proxy will receive a ticket for each application listed on the Proxy Designation Form.
5. On the date of the Purchase, or at least no later than the next day, the Proxy will inform the Applicant: (i) that the requested purchase has been completed; (ii) the ticket number that each application identified on the Proxy Designation Form has been assigned; and (iii) where and how the purchased Ticket(s) will be kept secure until the date of the Prioritization Draw or make other arrangements agreeable to the Applicant for the safe and secure retention of the purchased Tickets, including delivery of the Tickets to the Applicant at the Applicant's request.
6. If Applicant requests, the Proxy will attend the Prioritization Draw on 17 December 2012.
7. The Proxy authorizes ICANN to publish the name and contact information of the Proxy sufficient to allow Applicant(s) to contact the Proxy.
8. Once the Applicant has contacted the Proxy, the Proxy will contact ICANN to confirm that the Applicant has one or more active Applications.
